Special Cyber-Security Presentation Slated

FBI Deputy Assistant Director, Cyber Division and Top Technology Professional to Address Cyber Threats and Security

Following up on its well-received, December special event on "Counterterrorism and Extremist Ideology" that featured FBI subject matter experts, Arizona InfraGard is again raising the bar in member education with its April event on Cyber Security.



Presenting at the event is Steve Chabinsky, FBI Deputy Assistant Director, Cyber Division and Dr. Phyllis Schneck, VP and Chief Technology Officer, McAfee Inc. Deputy Assistant Director Chabinsky oversees all FBI investigative and outreach efforts focused on protecting the US from cyber attack and numerous other high technology crimes. Dr. Schneck, who is the Founding Chairman and Chairman Emeritus of InfraGard National Members Alliance, will share her thought leadership and expertise in the realm of cyber security and global threat intelligence and mitigation.

"This event will epitomize our mission of information sharing to the private sector" stated Anthony Farinacci, FBI Special Agent and Arizona InfraGard Coordinator. "We realize there is a significant demand for this level of subject matter expertise, specifically for all matters cyber-connected."

Given his schedule, Chabinsky will be presenting live from FBI Headquarters via Video Teleconference. In addition, a briefing by the FBI Field Intelligence Group regarding cyber matters for the state of Arizona will conclude the event.

Steven R. Chabinsky – Deputy Assistant Director, FBI

Mr. Chabinsky serves as Deputy Assistant Director within the FBI's Cyber Division. The Cyber Division manages all FBI domestic and international investigative and outreach efforts focused on protecting the United States from cyber attack, cyber espionage, online child exploitation, Internet fraud, intellectual property rights theft, and other high technology crimes. Mr. Chabinsky recently returned to the FBI after completing a joint duty assignment with the Office of the Director of National Intelligence (ODNI) where he served as Assistant Deputy Director of National Intelligence for Cyber (Acting), the Chair of the National Cyber Study Group, and the Director of the Joint Interagency Cyber Task Force. In these roles, Mr. Chabinsky led the ODNI's efforts to coordinate, monitor, and provide recommendations to the President regarding implementation of U.S. cyber strategy. Prior to his ODNI tour, Mr. Chabinsky served as Chief of the FBI's Cyber Intelligence Section, where he organized and led the FBI's analysis and reporting on terrorism, foreign intelligence, and criminal matters having a cyber threat nexus.



Dr. Phyllis Schneck - VP and CTO, Public Sector, McAfee Inc.

Dr. Phyllis Schneck is Chief Technology Officer for Public Sector at McAfee, Inc. In this role, she is responsible for the technical vision for public sector applications of security and global threat intelligence, strategic thought leadership around technology and policy in cyber security, and leading McAfee initiatives in adaptive security and intelligence in networks for critical infrastructure protection and cross-sector cyber security.

For more than 14 years, Schneck has had a distinguished presence in the security and infrastructure protection community, most recently as a Commissioner and a working group Co-Chair on public-private partnership, and a working group Chair on Network Situational Awareness for the CSIS Commission to Advise the 44th President on Cyber Security. Schneck recently Co-Chaired the Critical Infrastructure Protection (CIP) Congress and is leading the follow-up effort for the first global strategic plan for CIP. Schneck currently represents McAfee, Inc. on the Enduring Security Framework, and is the Chairman of the Board of Directors of the National Cyber Forensics and Training Alliance, a partnership between corporations, government and law enforcement for cyber analysis to combat international cyber crime.

Schneck served for eight years as chairman of the National Board of Directors of the FBI's InfraGard program, growing the InfraGard program from 2000 members to over 30,000 nationwide. She was primarily responsible for the strategic growth and vision of the private sector side of the InfraGard Program, and for growing the relationship between InfraGard and the Department of Homeland Security (DHS) through several Directorates. Schneck was also the founding president of InfraGard Atlanta.

The online training provides guidance to individuals and organizations on how to improve security in the workplace. The course is self-paced and takes about an hour to complete. This comprehensive cross-sector training is appropriate for a broad audience regardless of knowledge and skill level. The course promotes workplace security practices applicable across all [18 critical infrastructure sectors](#). The training uses innovative multimedia scenarios and modules to illustrate potential security threats. Threat scenarios include:

- Access & Security Control
- Workplace Violence
- Criminal & Suspicious Activities
- Cyber Threats

The course also features interactive knowledge reviews, employee tools, and additional resources. Upon completion of Workplace Security Awareness, employees will be able to:

- Identify potential risks to workplace security
- Describe measures for improving workplace security
- Determine the actions to take in response to a security situation

These speakers did an excellent job of communicating the key issues faced by our region and the progress that has been made as a result of their collaboration with one another, the FBI, and the other law enforcement agencies in the state. The resounding theme of their presentation was collaboration, which was evidenced by their participation. I thank each of them for their efforts and support of the annual meeting.

To continue with the theme of collaboration, I would like to point out a few of the groups who were also in attendance and supported the event. We had many “presidents” attend, including the President of the US Marshal’s Posse (USMP) in Arizona, Jerry Kosowsky, the President of the FBI Phoenix Citizens Academy Alumni Association, Chuck Matthews, and Chapter President’s from InfraGard Los Angeles and InfraGard San Diego, John Wentworth and Bruce Churchill, respectively. These organizations were a great support to this event and to our mission. They have my thanks as well.

In addition, our partners in AZ PASS were in attendance: Billy Ross, Private Sector Coordinator, Arizona Division of Emergency Management; Christine Figueroa, Arizona Protective Security Advisor, Department of Homeland Security; and Jennifer O’Neill, Community Liaison Program Coordinator, Arizona Counter Terrorism Information Center. Their support in our event is very much appreciated.

The highlight of the meeting for me was the special recognition given to several InfraGard members whose contributions of actionable information directly contributed to the mission of the FBI. This was the first time since my start as InfraGard Coordinator in 2008 that we have recognized members at the annual member meeting for their efforts. The Arizona InfraGard Board and I felt that it was important to recognize key and specific member contributions and efforts that occurred in 2010.

The first Award of Recognition presented was to the executive leadership team from Crystal IT (with their prior approval), a local company based in Anthem, Arizona. Accepting the award were

The award was for their efforts in reporting a cyber related matter they identified at their company, which ultimately contributed to the intelligence mission of the FBI. Prior to reporting this information these men were not InfraGard members, however as a result of encouragement of an active InfraGard member and interaction with the FBI, they joined InfraGard and have become a partner with us.

Additionally, an Award of Recognition was presented to an individual for their significant contribution to the FBI and the mission of InfraGard in relation to protecting the Critical Infrastructure and Key Resources of the US from terrorism and cyber related activity. This individual was recognized "anonymously" to maintain their confidentiality and trust in the FBI; the award was later given in person to the individual by FBI Agents.

The contributions of these individuals exemplifies what InfraGard is all about: the collaborative sharing of information between the private sector and law enforcement to protect the interests of our country's critical infrastructure and key resource assets. How often do we sit around and ask ourselves, "What is the relevancy of events happening half way around the globe to our lives here in the US?"

Possibly more to the point, how do we have any power to respond to the events that do occur, or can we make a difference if we do respond? The short answer to both of these questions is that an event occurring in distant lands can directly affect us, and active engagement in InfraGard certainly empowers each of you to have a direct impact in responding to these seemingly insurmountable threats to our way of life.

In the 2004 psychological thriller 'The Butterfly Effect', the premise captured the sensitive dependence on initial conditions in chaos theory; namely, a small change at one place in a complex system can have large effects elsewhere. Today, this tenet of chaos theory is widely employed in simulation and war-gaming models to describe with probabilities cause and effect relationships that contribute to an outcome. This is particularly applicable in assessing events happening half way around the world that ultimately affect our daily lives directly. In fact, this premise directly supports Infragard's increasing relevancy in response to seemingly unrelated events occurring as far away as the Mideast and Africa, or as close as Mexico.

For those fortunate enough to attend this year's 'sold out' Annual Member Meeting in January, you heard poignantly but factually in the keynote about the not so far removed threat on our Southern Border and how ATF, DEA and the US Marshal's Office are collaborating to proactively address and respond to the threat. With tens of thousand's of people being killed over the past three years by the drug cartels operating in our back yard, the threat is real and uncomfortably close to home. The threat level to Americans is highlighted by the recent death of an Immigrations and Customs Enforcement ("ICE") officer killed in Mexico's Monterey area.

My AZ Infragard Annual Report to the membership highlighted events in Africa and the Arabian Peninsula over the past year. These areas have historically not been covered extensively by the mainstream media, given the focus on the war on terror in Afghanistan and Iraq. More strikingly, the main counterterrorism response to threats on US soil last year targeted Al Shabaab (not Al Qaida), an African terrorist affiliate of Al-Qaida based in Somalia.

Al Shabaab's first attacks outside of Somalia were a bombing in Uganda tied to the World Cup celebrations. Shortly after this event, the federal government undertook the single largest counterterrorism operation on US soil since 9/11, charging 18 Somali's in the US with aiding a terrorist organization. This was followed by the FBI arrest of a man of Somali origin in Oregon accused of the attempted Christmas bombing. The observation here is that while some of the culprits were Somali nationals in the US, many of those arrested were naturalized or native US citizens. Clearly, there have also been increasing cases of disgruntled US citizens being successfully recruited by radical Islam or drug cartel interests directly on US soil.

While US response has historically targeted the threat from without, the threat from within is real, growing and increasingly the source of concern. Why smuggle in foreign nationals when you can simply recruit within the US? Regardless, the long tentacles of Radical Islam and other radical ideologies are driving the philosophy that creates the threat that needs to be addressed whether from expatriates in the US or home grown terrorists. The point is that radical ideologies abroad are emerging as an 'export product' that directly threatens US interests at home and abroad, building on an already growing threat of domestic terrorism.

The response to the war on terror has been to acknowledge that the most effective strategy is

to engage the local population to take the lead in extracting the insurgents. In areas of the world with cultural diversity that differs from our own this is a challenging proposition, but one that the US is nonetheless aggressively pursuing through our military actions. This response to so called '4th Generation Warfare' addresses an enemy generally driven by a radical theology that crosses traditional nation state borders and boundaries, is well financed and committed to its cause. It is also an enemy that blends with the population; therefore gaining the trust of the local population is the most effective means of addressing insurgency.

This same strategy also responds effectively to an enemy that is increasingly blending with our population in the US, leveraging upon the democratic freedoms that are at the core of our society. Here the enemy is trying to blend into our communities and the correct response is to build the bond of trust between the citizens and the government to actively engage in bi-lateral communication that can target the proper response to address the threat. This threat extends beyond the physical acts of terrorism, and also includes economic, financial and technology exposure, increasingly. Hence, the butterfly effect is at work, and the unrest in the Mideast and Africa, whether driven directly by radical Islam or supported by its followers, leads to increased exposure within our borders. A watchful citizenship can most effectively curtail this threat through awareness and through vigilantly reporting anything that appears suspicious. Law enforcement simply can't be everywhere; it has to rely on a watchful nation for actionable leads and intelligence. More so, this same tenet of chaos theory suggests that small actions in the US that respond to the threat can result in large impacts on these organizations worldwide.

The bottom line is that every one of us has the power to change world events through action within our control. InfraGard provides a unique set of tools to members that enhance communication bilaterally, both through providing actionable information and intelligence to you, and through your communicating information to the FBI. This in fact is InfraGard's Mission through its Arizona membership, now approaching 1,000 strong, and our national membership that now exceeds 44,000. This formidable force of engaged citizens also effectively addresses the domestic terrorist threat from our own citizens or even individual random acts of violence or criminal activity. With this in mind, I challenge each of you to more fully engage in InfraGard:

- If you are not yet a member, become a member
- If you are a member become more active
- If you are actively engaged, recruit others
- If you are ready to step up, consider participating actively on a committee or the Board
- Stay aware of the threat and communicate suspicious activity to the proper authority

Meeting this challenge, each of you has the potential to individually change the world. Just as the butterfly flapping its wings represents a small change in the initial condition of the system, ultimately leading to large-scale alterations of events, your being actively engaged in sharing domain expertise or communicating suspicious activity that you recognize more effectively through InfraGard's education, training and intelligence communications can lead to significant impact on the worldwide war on terrorism and securing our own national infrastructure.

One small action on your part can lead to a chain reaction of events that is larger than you may ever imagine. But it all starts with you deciding to make a difference through engaging and acting decisively. As you will see in the Infragard Coordinator's column this month, a number of your fellow members were recognized at the Annual Meeting for their contributions that supported the FBI in criminal investigations. Those recognized are no different than you; they simply stepped up and made a difference. Please engage and join this elite team this year so that we can recognize your contribution to protecting our national infrastructure. We thank you for stepping up to this challenge and keeping InfraGard relevant now to protect our immediate interests and those of future generations. YOU are InfraGard; YOU make the difference!

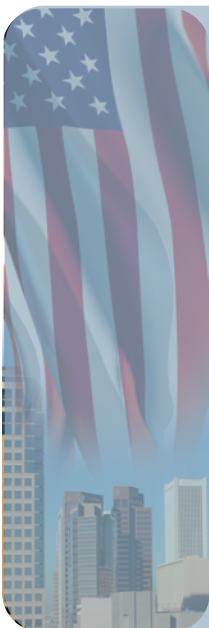
WHAT WE DO Because our members are vetted by the FBI, we can do information sharing: member to member, FBI to and from members, Intelligence bulletins to and from members and the Department of Homeland Security to members.

ABOUT INFRAGARD Arizona InfraGard is an alliance between the Arizona Office of the Federal Bureau of Investigation and individuals committed to protecting the nation's infrastructure and its people. The members, who are representative of all infrastructure sectors, public and private, identify and mitigate physical and cyber threats through information sharing. Arizona InfraGard promotes best practices, security awareness and training, community outreach, and the exchange of information between law enforcement and infrastructure owners and operators.
